We currently have two opportunities available for students. Our student fellowship program, where current students are matched with our current fellows to conduct high-quality research to be presented at the MAPOR annual conference this year, is currently accepting applications through April 30th. More information about the student paper competition will be released once the call for abstracts for the upcoming 2025 MAPOR conference opens, but it is never too early to start thinking about what to submit!

Secretary Treasurer's Update

MAPOR continues in great financial health. The bank accounts total to approximately \$65,000, and we expect them to grow as we begin to seek conference sponsorships. Recognizing the challenges faced by our industry and colleagues, we are actively exploring ways to use these funds to make conference attendance more accessible, particularly as we approach our 50th anniversary celebration. Membership is also strong after another (!) record year in 2024. We currently have 358 current members, including 305 general members and 53 students, and anticipate a membership bump with conference registration in the fall.
